Question	What are the allowable levels of contaminants in the air in an occupied space?	
Long Answer	 ASHRAE does not establish such levels. There are ambient air levels established by the <u>US EPA</u>. The <u>ACGIH</u> and establish allowable levels for the industrial environment. <u>ASHRAE Standard 62.1-2016</u>, "Ventilation for Acceptable Indoor Air Quality", includes an informative Appendix C, Summary of Selected Air Quality Guidelines. Tables C-1 and C-2, give other standards available in the US for many other common indoor air pollutants.
